

From "The Loft"...

As we continue through Spring and look to the Summer, the church enters a season simply called the Season of Pentecost. Apart from the Sunday of Pentecost where we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit (May 12th this year), not much happens in the life of the church until we get to Advent again. The "formal" purpose is to reflect on the growth and purpose of the church.

Robert's sermon series will spend time dissecting the Book of Acts and studying the movement of the Early Church. But in this long season where we sort of trudge on through life, consider what the Early Church went through after the coming of the Holy Spirit. Rapid growth and expansion met fringe theories and theologies; councils were formed to talk about the life and purpose of the church. (Church legend says that the saint we based Santa Claus on punched a heretic at one of the meetings.) All of this because the fire of the Spirit was uncontainable, wanted to spread, be heard, and feed the church.



I think of a fairly new hymn "Spirit, Spirit of Gentleness" by James K. Manley. The chorus calls to the Spirit: "Spirit, spirit of gentleness, blow through the wilderness, calling and free. Spirit, spirit of restlessness. stir

me from placidness, wind, wind on the sea." This hymn notates all the times the Spirit walked with the people of God. It was there in the desert, when they crossed Jordan. It was there when Christ was born. But most importantly, the Holy Spirit moves today:

"You call from tomorrow, you break ancient schemes. From the bondage of sorrow all the captives dream dreams: our women see visions, our men clear their eyes.

With bold new decisions your people arise." Our worship does not spend enough time talking about the Holy Spirit. However, it is ever present. In this coming season, ponder all the ways the Spirit has moved and is moving. It calls us from tomorrow and brings us comfort today. In His Service,
